His first coming certainly did involve God taking the form of a helpless baby, Jesus, whose mission was to save a badly broken world, finding lost people and bringing light into the darkness.


These are all deeply theological and profoundly significant truths, but also, at the heart of Jesus' coming, was His love for us. WE excite Him!

Seven Christmas Ponderings



The first Christmas was certainly full of mind-boggling events and surprises! Ponder one of these points each day as Christmas approaches.

1. God keeps His promises

The people of Israel had been expecting a Messiah, because God had promised. See Isaiah 7:14 & 9:6; Micah 5:2; there are others – can you list some? What Biblical promises are you walking in now and what are your expectations of God for your future?

2. God became a man

We believe Jesus was 100% man and 100% God. Ask God the Holy Spirit to help you reflect on this mystery and to show you something new that it means for you today – give Him time to show you.

3. Look at where Jesus started

In poverty, obscurity and in the least expected company! (I have to pinch myself here – we are talking about God, the creator and sustainer of the earth)! It is surely a lie of the enemy that would have us think that Jesus would not want to be with us, just as we are. What is the story of Jesus coming to you? Where, when, how? How is He speaking to you today? What is He saying?

4. Jesus shows us what God is like

The Word became flesh and dwelt among us (John 1:14). God is born as man and in so doing He experienced birth, vulnerability, danger, rejection and near death in a world of uncertainty. What does this teach you about God and how does that help you on your journey?

Jesus brings Joy

It's heart-warming to read the joy that Jesus' birth brought – ' they returned glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen.' (Luke 2:8-20). Take time to reflect and praise God for all you have heard and seen of Him in your life, and in those around you. Would it bring joy to someone else to hear your good news stories?

6. **Jesus' birth challenges**

King Herod was not happy; the presence of Jesus made him uncomfortable, to put it mildly (Matthew 2:16-18). The truth is, we are all made uncomfortable by some of His teaching. What areas of your life need a touch from Jesus Christ to help you to be all you are created to be? Ask the Helper, Holy Spirit, to help you attend to these things?

7. Through Jesus salvation is possible

Today in the town of David a Saviour has been born to you: He is the Messiah, the Lord. (Luke 2:11). The starting point is knowing I am a sinner and I need a Saviour! Have you received God's salvation? If yes, rejoice with great joy and praise Him. If you're unsure or know you haven't, but would like the guarantee you are forgiven for your sins, and that He is your Saviour, then pray a simple prayer. Say sorry for all that is wrong in your life and ask Jesus to come into your life to be Lord and Saviour. Ask for an infilling of the Holy Spirit; He is here to help us walk with Jesus.

Mother of all Miracles

s God being born on earth in Jesus the Mother of all Miracles?

One of our founding Chaplains, George Bennett, argues: "If we believe Jesus performed miracles while on earth; and we believe Jesus died, rose again and is alive today; and we believe that he is the same yesterday, today and forever – then surely our conclusion is that we believe he still performs miracles today!"

R.T. Kendall describes a miracle as 'the extraordinary that cannot be explained naturally', and also 'anything from an answer to prayer, to awesome providence to God's raw power'.

What is your personal experience of miracles? Reflect on some miracle stories and allow your faith to be stirred. We follow a miracle working God!

Scripture records that 'God with people' is **noticeable**, for example:

Abraham: Genesis 21:22 Joseph: Genesis 39:2-4 Moses: Exodus 33:14-17

and appealing:

Zechariah 8:23; "Let us go with you, because ... God is with you."

Imagine the stir a walk down the street with the Queen would cause! How much more so with God?

Scripture promises that God is with you: Isaiah 43:1-4; Matthew 18:20 & 28:20; and John 15:5-7ff – the promised Holy Spirit.
