Fresh Springs

e are grateful to God for leading us into this new season of 'Fresh Springs.' Something new is indeed springing up from the desert, as Isaiah 43:19 proclaims. We have been powerfully reminded that Howard Cobb, CCHC's founder, built the well on our grounds in 1932 in order to increase the water supply to the house. Although he anticipated finding water at 40ft, he found it at 80ft. He had to dig deeper than expected. "The opening of Howard's Well café' with its short Midday Encounter service at noon is one part of the 'Fresh Springs.'

Come and See!


One guest prayed that the new 'Covid Way' will be a blessing and it is our hope that this season of Fresh Springs will be that and more. God is good, as the following two guests declare!


Some Reflections on Thankfulness
