

Learning to the Ephesians warns his readers to be very careful how they live, 'because the days are evil' (Ephesians 5:16). The Greek word for 'evil' derives from another which translates as 'laborious trouble'. It emphasises evil's desire to 'steal, kill and destroy'. I have a growing sense that St Paul's words are very relevant for us today.

I wonder what pain, misery and darkness you may have experienced at evil's influence, or may be experiencing now. The Lord is near to meet you – call out to Him, He will hear your cry. You can also phone in with your name (or someone else's) and we'll pray for you each day for three months, and there is also the option of coming to CCHC, a safe place, to encounter the Lord and seek Him for peace, healing and freedom.

Whatever the season or circumstances we face, learning to walk in the power of the Holy Spirit, so that we may 'seek first the kingdom of God' and 'His will' for our lives, is vital

schooling we continuously need. The Spirit helps in so many ways, not least of all with faith, protection and prayer so that we may STAND confidently in our identity in Jesus Christ.

The truth is, suffering, sin and falling are part of life's experience. We only deceive ourselves to think we might avoid them. This is why Jesus came – to heal, save and help us stand. With the love and grace of God, we can reach the destiny he has for us.

In this REVIVE! Newsletter I'm looking at four lesser-known songs in the Bible. Their background stories include, peace, war, life, death and victory, and share something of people who came through very difficult situations. As you reflect on the stories, and enjoy the songs, be reminded, whatever your circumstances, that God is sovereign and is working His purpose out. He will complete the work He has begun, in you and in the world. This is our hope and our song!

Tests and Triumphs!



he Song of Moses, in Exodus 15, is all about God! (It's the first song in the Bible and the first recorded time that Israel prayed together – in song!) Poetically and cleverly woven into the song is the journey of the Israelites and how God defeated the Egyptians. It's a song of God's triumph, and His people's faith. Through some seriously tough times they called out to Him again and again, and He responded at His appointed time!

My three favourite verses from this song are:

- * The Lord is my strength, my song, my salvation.
- * God's unfailing love and strength will lead and guide me to His holy dwelling.
- * The Lord reigns, forever and ever.

As you read the song in Exodus 15, ask the Holy Spirit to speak to you through it. What verses jump out at you and why?

Moving forward to the New Testament, the focus changes to Jesus. As we look at what Christ has done for us by His death, burial and resurrection, we do well to sing. What hymn best stirs your faith and celebrates Christ's victory for you?

Short and so, so sweet!

The two shortest songs in the Bible, are set in completely different circumstances. One is sung in a time of peace and security in a Temple and the other in war and insecurity on a battle field.

As you read the background stories, notice three things. God's people seek Him in prayer; they listen for His answer and then they obey Him.

* 'God is good! His love endures forever.'

2 Chronicles 5:20 (full story is chapter 5:12 to 6:12). As they sang, God's presence so filled the Temple and the service was bought to a standstill! Ask the Spirit to envelope you with Father's loving presence as you sing.

* 'Give thanks to the LORD, for His love endures forever.'

2 Chronicles 20:21 (full reading 20:1-30). The battle was the Lord's, not theirs. In faith the people sang this song, and without lifting a finger their enemy was defeated!

Both songs tell of God's enduring love! We need to know that whether in times of peace, or of war, we are loved by God and in Him 'we live and move and have our being.'

Revelation 15 records another triumphant song!

"Great and marvellous are your deeds, Lord God Almighty. Just and true are your ways, King of the nations. Who will not fear you, Lord, and bring glory to your name? For you alone are holy. All nations will come and worship before you, for your righteous acts have been revealed."

This song is being sung in heaven (now) by followers of Jesus, who have overcome the enemy and the trials of life.

St John writes to encourage people suffering severe persecution. In 'evil' days, such as ours, be encouraged as you reflect on the words. Let them minister to you and use them to offer praise to the Lord.

- God does 'great and marvellous works.' He redeemed Israel from Egyptian slavery, and through the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus, offers the world redemption from sin, the evil one and death.
- He is 'Lord God Almighty'. To suffering people this name offers comfort and hope.
- In the midst of confusion, injustice and dishonesty, God's ways are, 'just and true?
- In a world of man-made and human idols God is 'King of the nations!'
- The song rhetorically asks 'Who will not fear you Lord, and bring glory to your name?
- He is worthy of worship and makes salvation possible because; 'you alone are holy.
- One day 'all the nations will come and worship before you.'

Praise the Lord!


God, you are ...
