

S Lewis famously wrote about Four Loves. He obviously hadn't discovered chocolate yet! Joking aside, he very helpfully brought to our attention that in English we have one word for love, whereas in Greek, the language of the New Testament, there are at least four words indicating various aspects of love. *Philia* has to do with the love shown through friendship; *storge* relates to affection, and *eros* to romantic love.

The Greek word *agape* on the other hand is infused with even richer and deeper meanings. It is a love which acts towards another person for his/her best good, irrespective of whether they deserve it or not and independent of personal likes, preferences or feelings. It is an unconditional love.

Agape love is exemplified by Jesus, who voluntarily went to the excruciating cross to save us from our sins, to give us new life and bring us into a relationship with Father God (John 3:16; 17:3). We didn't deserve it; it cost Jesus immense suffering and ultimately His death because He loved (*agape*) us. We, His followers, are called to love with the same (*agape*) love (John 13:35).

The title of this, and previous newsletters, is REVIVE! What if we, the 3,000 or so people who will read this, were to ask God today who and how we are to *agape*, despite the season of social distancing we find ourselves in? Wouldn't we cause a mini tidal wave! Do you want to REVIVE **and** be part of it?

In these times of social distancing, we have seen so many acts of kindness and generosity from thousands of volunteers who have been reaching out with love and solidarity to each other during this time of lockdown. In the UK, thousands of volunteers, including Christians, have been part of neighbourhood support groups, helping with food banks and kitchens.

Christians have set up feeding stations in the Ghatsila area of India to feed huge numbers of people who walked thousands of miles back to their home villages following lockdown. Two hundred brave Cuban doctors flew to South Africa to help with the pandemic there, and aid was sent to the much neglected Shipibo-Konibo indigenous peoples living in the Amazonian area near Pucallpa in Peru, who have seen many deaths from the virus.

In Naples, baskets with a difference were left out for folk who needed food, but those who didn't were invited to put food in the baskets.

LOVE Building Reminders


