

fter Jesus rose from the dead, he met many people but not everyone recognised Him. One was despairing Cleopas, who thought Jesus was dead. (Luke 24. 13 – 35). During their heart-warming encounter, Cleopas said to the apparent stranger, 'But we had hoped that Jesus was the one ...'.

Grief and loss can be painful, heart breaking and exhausting. This pandemic has robbed people of so much and most sadly, loved ones. Despair is real and at times experienced by all people. In challenging seasons – we struggle too, and it's healthy and honest to admit this.

Cleopas' story helps. In his darkness, the promises of God in Scripture brought

Walk on with Hope in your heart!

arlier this year, Colonel Tom Moore → had a vision to raise money for the NHS by walking around his garden 100 times with the aid of his zimmer frame. Hope Building Reminders

- 1. Any hope that believers in Jesus have is from God by the power of the Holy Spirit. Hope is not something we can stir up by our own effort (Romans 5:5).
- 2. Against all hope, Abraham in hope, believed ... (Romans 4:18) When all hope as a human possibility failed, Abraham placed his hope in God. We have a part to play we BELIEVE!
- 3. Christ in you, the hope of glory (Colossians 1:27).
- 4. The content of a believer's hope boasts about the glory of God (Romans 5:1-2), for which we were created (Isaiah 43:7).
- 5. Suffering, trials and testing produce and strengthen hope; note the similarities between Paul, James and Peter's teaching in Romans 5:3-4, James 1:2-4 and 1 Peter 1:6-7.

For one week, actively write down God's blessings.

Day 1: Identify a blessing that came to you from a family member.

Day 2: Identify a blessing from a stranger.

- Day 3: Identify a blessing from technology (radio, telephone, internet, television).
- Day 4: Identify a blessing from a friend.
- Day 5: Identify a blessing in something you read.
- Day 6: Identify a blessing from creation (animals, environment etc).
- Day 7: Use day seven to thank God for your week of blessings and actively bless a friend, family member and stranger today.
